



The Do's and Don'ts of making your Residence Hall Room your own



DO Bring:

- ◆ Bedding (Standard Twin size)
- ◆ Blankets/comforters
- ◆ Pillow
- ◆ Lamps—NON Halogen and no “octopus” lights
- ◆ Clocks/stereos
- ◆ Surge protector power strip (needs to have an on/off switch)
- ◆ Microwave (below 900 watts)
- ◆ Mini Fridge (5 cubic feet or below)
- ◆ Laundry basket and laundry materials
- ◆ Shower caddy
- ◆ Shower shoes
- ◆ A fan
- ◆ Painter's Tape or 3M tape and hooks
- ◆ Decorations and pictures—make your room your own!
- ◆ Cable Cords for televisions
- ◆ Trash Can

Things to consider bringing:

- ◆ Cooking supplies (pots, silverware, etc.)
- ◆ Crockpots, kettles, rice cookers (can only be used in kitchen areas, not in individual student rooms)
- ◆ Air fresheners that are not plug-in
- ◆ Telephone (land lines are available in rooms if requested)
- ◆ First-Aid kit
- ◆ Regular bed risers- lift the bed for more storage space!

DO NOT Bring:

- ◆ Furniture. A desk, chair, bed, mattress, dresser and closet are all provided and need to stay in your room.
- ◆ Extension cords.
- ◆ Pets. The only exception are toothless fish in a 5 gallon tank or less.
- ◆ Candles or candle warmers
- ◆ Incense of any kind
- ◆ Air conditioners (neither window nor floor models)
- ◆ Space heaters of any kind
- ◆ Toaster, toaster oven, hot plates, Foreman Grills, drip coffee makers, or anything with an exposed heating element
- ◆ Plug-in air fresheners
- ◆ Decorative lighting like string lights or holiday lights.
- ◆ Electric blankets
- ◆ Lava lamps or high-intensity lamps
- ◆ Nails, screws, tacks, duct tape for the wall
- ◆ Tapestries and large wall coverings
- ◆ Bed Risers with built in outlets- these are considered extension cords!
- ◆ Curtains- all rooms come with blinds or shades.
